# Thought for the Week

### A DIFFERENT HEART AND A NEW SPIRIT

Ezekiel 11: 17a, 19-20

These are the words of the Lord God: I will give them a heart of flesh. Then they will conform to my statutes and become their God.

#### Reflection

In December 1967, Dr. Christiaan Barnard performed the first human heart transplant at Groote Schuur Hospital in South Africa. It was an operation that (Taken from Old Testament Treasures) stunned and enthralled the world, for few had believed it could ever be achieved. In those early days, life expectancy for the patient was relatively short; today, Prayer this miracle of modern science means a new beginning and a fresh chapter in life for innumerable people.

The words of Ezekiel are figurative rather than literal, yet the transplant they speak of is no less dramatic - if anything, it is more so – for what the prophet is talking about is people being changed not physically but spiritually. Can that really happen? Not according to Take what I can never change, worldly wisdom. 'A leopard cannot change its spots,' we say; 'Once a thief always a thief.'

It's hard as life goes by not to share such a cynical view of the human psyche.

The people of Ezekiel's day felt much the same, greeting his words with scepticism if not outright scorn. Quite simply, they'd heard it all before. Experience had different heart and put a new spirit into them; I will take taught them that they would go on making the same the heart of stone out of their bodies and give them a mistakes in the future as they had in the past. Ezekiel, though, believed differently, confident that God had the keep my laws. They will become my people and I will power to change people deep within. His words, of course, were to find fulfilment in the coming of Jesus and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Through Christ, the work of renewal has begun; work that will continue until the day we are united with him in the kingdom of God. Never lose sight of that promise. Never forget what God has done or what he shall do.

Gracious God

Have mercy on me,

Pardon my weakness

And renew me through your Holy Spirit.

Put a new heart and a right spirit within me.

And, by your grace, make me new.

#### Track and Trace

Please note that each of the churches (& The Bridge) have their own Track and Trace QR code. This is easy to use with a smart phone.

All you need is the NHS Covid app, follow it's instructions and then every time you enter the church buildings (or other places too) just open the app and point it at the code. This then logs where you have been without you needing to sign in.

We need to get used to this as it could well be the new normal for the time being.
